When I get to the museum.....



When I arrive, I will go through the glass doors into the museum.

Where are the toilets?



The toilets are beside the entrance to the museum, I will see them on my righthand side as soon as I go in. There is a large disabled toilet and separate rooms with three toilets for boys or girls.

Finding out where everything is




In the reception area, I can get a map that tells me where all of the activities and entertainers are. It has symbols which show me if places could be noisy and have lots of people.

Understanding the map.....


The map has symbols which will show me the sorts of things I can do around the event.

There will be things I can **touch** 

Some places might be **noisy**. One line shows some noise and three lines means it could be too loud. 

Some areas may have a strong **smell** 

There will be lots of things to **see** 

Some spaces might have lots of **people** 

I can visit all the places and it's very easy to move on if I find it overwhelming or don't like it.

What can I do at Discover Bucks Museum?



There are lots and lots of things for me to see and do.
Inside there are tables with activities and
outside there are performances and people doing demonstrations.
Sometimes there are games outside too.

Inside



There are people in old fashioned clothes or costumes.
Some of them will show me how to make old things,
and sometimes I can have a go.
There are also games for me to play and
things to colour-in or make.

How do I find the activities?



There are signs to help me find where the different things are.

Outside



There are more people in old fashioned clothes.
They will show me lots of different things.
Sometimes they do shows and ask for volunteers,
I can help if I want, but I don't have to.
I can just watch everything if I want to.

When I get to the Kings Head.....



When I arrive from either George Street or Market Street,
I will go under the archways into the courtyard.

Where are the toilets?



Toilets are in the back corner of the courtyard.
There are separate toilets for boys and girls,
and a large disabled one I can use.
I may need a code to unlock the padlock.
A member of staff will be able to help me.

What can I do at the King's Head?



There will be lots of things to see and do in the King's Head. There will be shows and demonstrations outside in the main courtyard, as well as a fun pub quiz I can take part in. Inside the dining room there will be music and talks. Some of these activities may need to be pre-booked.

What do I do if I need help?



I can ask the people in green t-shirts if I need any help. These people are called the Event Crew and are very kind.

The people wearing the special sunflower lanyards will be able to help me do all the things I would like too.

What do I do if I need some space?



There is a special place that I can go, if everything gets too much for me in Discover Bucks Museum. Here I can play with the toys and feel calm. They have lots of great things for me to do.

The people who work here can talk to me in sign language.

What happens in the parade?



When I am told, we will leave the museum and go to Market Square to watch the parade. There are lots of people and it can be very noisy.

What happens in the parade?



There is a band who walk and play music at the same time, they are very loud. I can borrow some ear defenders if I would like, or I can put my hands over my ears.

What happens in the parade?



There are lots of children and grown-ups in uniforms.

Some of them carry flags.

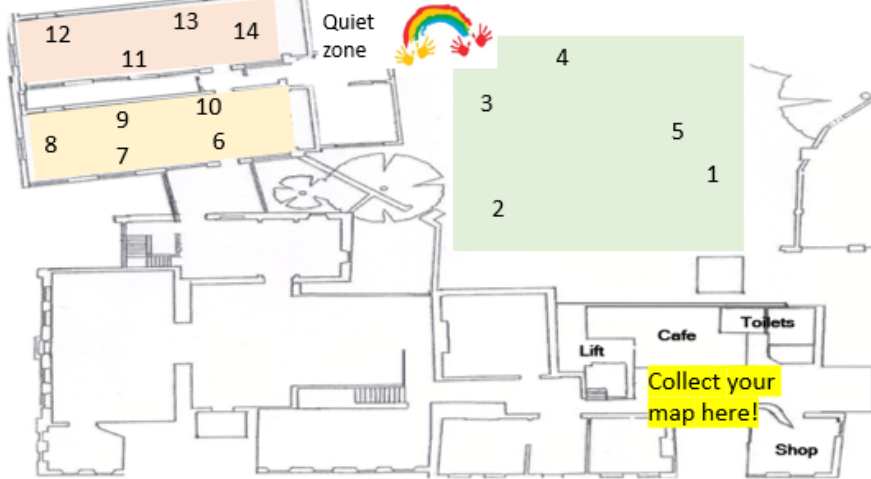
Everyone in the parade walks all the way around Market Square,
